Our Society is doing wonderful work in the camps of the displaced where tens of thousands of displaced are living in 5 camps.

The people in these camps are lacking many essential services to them that is why we established 6 community centres in these poor areas which provide the following services

1 - Vocational Training and education programmes:



The beneficiaries are about **1500 persons** per year where they **learn different skills** that enable them to be self reliant. They can learn one or more of 8 skills (masonry, cooking, home economics, computer, stoves manufacturing...).

There are 3 to 6 months sessions, benefiting groups of 120 to 240 people each time.

Our street children who graduate from the homes and farms the Society also runs can benefit from this program.

This program has been so successful that other Organizations have asked SVDP to train their adults. Such as Catholic Relief Services, Save the Children UK, ZOA a Refugees Camp Organization. **The UN** through UNIDO had evaluated our program and **qualified it as an excellent** quick impact project.





In addition, SSVP Sudan also provides **education to thousands of youth children with literacy** (in English and Arabic) and **arithmetic** classes that can allow them to join public schools after that.

2 - Babies Feeding Centers



The beneficiaries are about **10,000 to 12,000 babies** below age of 4. We give them **proper food 5 days a week** in 18 different centres.

3 - Medical Program:

We provide **medical** attention to about **50,000 patients** per year, of which 50% are children.. We also issue the necessary drugs and give the patients with health awareness services and provide protection services.



The program is conducted using mobile clinics, clinics that operate on Fridays (the official holiday) and fixed clinics.



The centers are equipped with professional medical staff, laboratories. We are able to treat 25 types of diseases including Malaria, which is a killer specially to children and infants.

Handicapped are also provided with moving chairs.



4 - Water Project:



Thousands of displaced receive clean water from the well we drilled in out of the camps.

All these projects led by SSVP Sudan in the displaced and refugees Camps are wonderful examples of Vincentian dedication and solidarity, but the demand for all this kind of assistance is huge, but the lack of financial means impedes a more developed attention.
